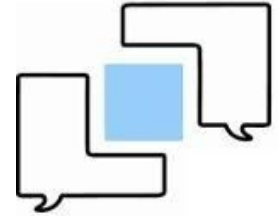


# Teaching at Washington English Center



Improving the lives of immigrants through education

Since 1993, **Washington English Center**, a community-based program, has offered English and literacy training to low-income adult immigrants in the greater Washington area using volunteer teachers and tutors.

### NO teaching experience necessary

- volunteers attend pre-service training
- additional training and ongoing support throughout the term
- classes are taught in English

### WEC provides

- syllabus
- teacher's guide
- additional resources
- constructive feedback

- one-on-one tutor
- computer skills teacher
- conversation group leader
- citizenship teacher
- job coach
- volunteer office assistant
- librarian



### All Volunteers must:

- ✓ be 20 years old or older
- ✓ be a fluent English speaker
- ✓ make an 11-week commitment (one day a week)
- ✓ attend training before each session
- ✓ have regular access to email
- ✓ have the desire to work with adults from different cultural, educational, and economic backgrounds

The volunteer commitment for teaching is **1 day** per week, **2-3 hours** per week. **WEC** offers classes year-round – just pick a **term** and a **schedule** that work for you
