All Volunteers must:

- ✓ be 20 years old or older
- ✓ be a fluent English speaker
- ✓ make an 11-week commitment (one day a week)
- ✓ attend training before each session
- ✓ have regular access to email
- ✓ have the desire to work with adults from different cultural, educational, and economic backgrounds

The volunteer commitment for teaching is 1 day per week, 2-3 hours per week. WEC offers classes year-round – just pick a term and a schedule that work for you
